Hello and welcome to the December update. We wish you a happy holiday season.

Since our last newsletter in September 2022, we have:

- Bored almost 600 concrete piles, up to 20 metres deep. The piles will act as foundations to support the new Water Treatment Works.
- Continued to trace and expose the positions of existing underground services on the site, to make sure they are not compromised during the work.
For many of these services, we have used a vacuum excavator which sucks up the soil around the pipes and cables to prevent damage.

Over Christmas:

- We won't be carrying out any work on site from **Saturday, 24 December 2022 to Monday, 02 January 2023**. The site will be left secured. If you happen to see any unusual activity during this time, please call **0344 346 2020**.

Looking ahead to early 2023, we plan to:

- Begin excavations to install new pipes and underground tanks.
- Begin demolishing an existing reservoir which is over 100 years old. The extracted concrete will be crushed and graded to be re-used on site.
